

ABOUT PMI®:

The Project Management Institute (PMI)® is widely recognized for establishing the international standard for project management training. PMI® is a non-profit professional organization for the project management profession with the purpose of advancing the methodology and practice of project management.

Additionally, PMI® is the certifying organization for and offers multiple credentials in project management. These credentials are:

- Certified Associate in Project Management (CAPM)®
- Project Management Professional (PMP)®
- PMI Scheduling Professional (PMI-SP)®
- PMI Risk Management Professional (PMI-RMP)®
- Program Management Professional (PgMP)®

ABOUT PMI®'s Continuing Certification Requirements (CCRs):

- Once a project manager becomes a PMI® credential holder, they are required to participate in the Continuing Certification Requirements (CCR) Program. The certification/CCR cycle begins the day an exam is taken [and passed] and/or multi-rater assessment (for PgMP® credential holders) is completed, and ends on the same date three years later.
- To adhere to the CCR program, credential holders must participate in professional development activities where professional development units (PDUs) can be earned.
- PDUs are used to quantify approved professional development activities. Typically, one PDU is the equivalent of one hour (60 minutes) spent in a planned, structured professional development activity.
- Each credential requires a certain number of PDUs per three year credential cycle.
