  - AoL stands for Assurance of Learning
  - The process for AACSB is related to degree level
  - The CoB has two undergraduate degree programs
    - Health Administration and Bachelors of Business Administration

- The CoB has many graduate degree programs
  - Accounting, Finance, Economics, etc.
- Faculty decide a set of courses to measure student outcomes
- This is normally done annually or by semester
- There is one change that came out of the recent Program Reviews
- The MBA program assessment will be handled by Linsey Willis in Management Programs.
- 2022 2023 is our AACSB five year review visit.
- 6. B.A. in General Business Paul Hart, Marc Rhorer, Ethlyn Williams
  - Two documents were sent to the Faculty Proposal Overview and the other a more detailed description of a degree that needs discussion and vote
  - The Provost's office asked us to consider this degree
  - This degree will allow students who are more interested in business to focus on business courses, along with some electives they can take
  - IFP would be required
  - Students would have to take one class from each of the thematic groups:
    - Financial Systems and Practice
    - Technology and Data Applications
    - Management Operations and Leadership
    - Marketing and Promotion
    - International Business
  - Additional Requirements:
    - 12 upper level credits from the CoB
    - 8 credits of foreign language
    - 6 upper level credits from outside the CoB
    - Motion was passed that the courses pass with a grade of C or better
  - The BA in Business was approved by the Faculty Assembly
- 7. Annual Report of the Associate Dean of Research Siri Terjesen
  - Number of FAU and CoB co-authors (by journal ranking)
    - 4\* and FT 50 has dropped off from 15 in 2019-2020 to 5 in 2020 2021
